





**Cultural Tips For The Successful Grower**

**Albion Strawberry**

**Albion Strawberry** is a new release from UC Davis expected to replace Seascape in commercial growing. Fruit is long, conical, symmetrical; firm and crisp with excellent flavor. A great berry for preservation, processing, and storage. The plant grows upright with moderate runners. A great strawberry plant for use in a hanging basket. Resists verticillium wilt, phytophthora crown rot and some resistance to anthracnose crown rot.



**Planting Instructions:** - In the home garden strawberries make an excellent ground cover. No soil preparation is necessary if the flower bed is mulched with bark dust, saw dust, etc. Simply dig the plant in leaving the crown exposed at ground level. Never plant strawberries to a depth where the crown is buried. Avoid wadding the roots in the planting hole.
