





Cultural Tips For The Successful Grower

Stolo

Stolo- A late season strawberry plant is a cultivar that is well-adapted to the Pacific Northwest. Berries are very conical in shape and have bright red internal and external color. Fruit caps moderately well, so it is perhaps more suited for the local fresh market than for commercial processors. Plants have an upright growth habit and runners freely. It is resistant to strawberry root weevil.



Planting Instructions: - In the home garden strawberries make an excellent ground cover. No soil preparation is necessary if the flower bed is mulched with bark dust, saw dust, etc. Simply dig the plant in leaving the crown exposed at ground level. Never plant strawberries to a depth where the crown is buried. Avoid wadding the roots in the planting hole.
