





Cultural Tips For The Successful Grower Tribute

Tribute - Developed at the University of Maryland, introduced in 1982. Medium to large wedge shaped berries. Bright red skin, firm, light to medium flesh. Acidic but pleasant flavor. Best for fresh eating and good processing quality. Produces a good midseason Spring crop. Tribute is a medium size vigorous plant. Resistant to Red Stele, Powdery Mildew, Leaf Blight and Leaf Scorch. Tribute is widely adaptable for commercial use as well as the home gardener. Tribute size may drop in the heat of summer but will return with good flavor in the cooler fall weather. Well adapted to upland areas in the South and mild areas in the East and Pacific Northwest.



Planting Instructions: - In the home garden strawberries make an excellent ground cover. No soil preparation is necessary if the flower bed is mulched with bark dust, saw dust, etc. Simply dig the plant in leaving the crown exposed at ground level. Never plant strawberries to a depth where the crown is buried. Avoid wadding the roots in the planting hole.
