





**Cultural Tips For The Successful Grower**  
**Tulameen**  
**Red Raspberry**

**Tulameen:** Nootka parentage. Very large, red fruit make it one of the largest of all reds. Well suited to both processing and fresh market. High yields. Long harvest season (approximately 50 days). Ripens in July. Introduced in 1990. Zone 4-7



**Planting Instructions:** Tulameen can be planted in almost any sort of well-drained soil. Start by digging a large hole big enough to encompass all of the roots of the plant without bending or circling. Raspberries should be planted in the spring. They are usually spaced 2-3 feet in the row with 8-10 feet between the rows. Plant raspberries about one inch deeper than the plant grew in the nursery. The plant, as purchased from the nursery, may be cut back to a few inches as most of the growth will arise from the roots or from the base of the planted cane. Any white sprouts arising from the crown should be covered with soil to prevent burning by the sun.
