





Cultural Tips For The Successful Grower Valley Red

Valley Red is a new June-bearing strawberry cultivar from the USDA-ARS breeding program in Corvallis, OR released in cooperation with the Oregon Agricultural Experiment Station, Washington State University Agricultural Research Center, and Agriculture and Agri-Foods Canada. It was tested as ORUS 1790-1. Valley Red is a high-yielding cultivar that produces medium-sized fruit that are very uniform in size and shape. The fruit is easily capped and primarily suited for processing with its dark red internal and external color. Valley Red is named for its outstanding performance in the Willamette Valley in Oregon, the Skagit Valley in Washington, and the Fraser River Valley in British Columbia.



Planting Instructions: - In the home garden strawberries make an excellent ground cover. No soil preparation is necessary if the flower bed is mulched with bark dust, saw dust, etc. Simply dig the plant in leaving the crown exposed at ground level. Never plant strawberries to a depth where the crown is buried. Avoid wadding the roots in the planting hole.
